## What to Take to the Polls

### TEXAS REQUIRES MOST VOTERS TO SHOW IDENTIFICATION

Approved photo IDs must not be expired more than 4 years; for voters age 70 or older there is no limit on the expiration of the ID. The seven forms of approved photo IDs are:

- Texas Driver license issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- Texas Election Identification Certificate (EIC) issued by DPS
- Texas Personal Identification Card issued by DPS
- Texas license to carry a handgun issued by DPS
- US military identification card containing the person's photograph
- US citizenship certificate containing the person's photograph (Note: Does not expire)
- US passport

### OPTIONS

Voters who do not have any of the approved photo IDs and who are on the official list of registered voters may sign a simple form called a "reasonable impediment declaration" and vote a regular ballot if they present a:

- Valid voter registration certificate (card)
- Certified birth certificate (original)
- Current utility bill
- Bank statement
- Government check
- Paycheck
- Any other government document with the individual's name and address (original). ID address does not have to match the voter registration address.

Generally, you do not need a photo ID to vote by mail. In some cases, first time voters will be asked to supply a copy of an ID to vote by mail.

### WHAT ELSE TO TAKE TO THE POLLS

In addition to your photo ID, you can bring any written or printed material (including this *Voters Guide*) into the voting booth for your personal use. You cannot use mobile phones, smartphones and tablets or other electronic devices at the polling place. (Texas Election Code, Section 61.011)

**Lubbock ISD Bond Special Election, Proposition A:** The issuance of \$130,000,000 of bonds by the Lubbock Independent School District for school facilities including safety and security improvements and a new agricultural sciences facility and levying the tax in payment thereof.

**Venue Tax Special Election Proposition A:** Authorizing Lubbock County to develop a new multipurpose arena with adjacent facilities and any related infrastructure (the Venue Project) in Lubbock County that is capable of hosting a variety of events, including, but not limited to concerts, family shows, sporting events, community and high school sporting events and ceremonies, rodeos and other agricultural and equestrian shows, and to impose a short term motor vehicle rental tax at a rate not to exceed five percent (5%) of the gross receipts from the rental of a motor vehicle in Lubbock County, and a tax on the occupancy of a room in a hotel within the County at a rate not to exceed two percent (2%) of the price paid for the room, for the purpose of financing the Venue Project. If approved, the maximum hotel occupancy tax rate imposed from all sources in Lubbock County would be 15 percent (15%) of the price paid for a room in a hotel.
